This was our final game for the current season and my thanks go to all members who made themselves available during the season, especially those who filled in at short notice.

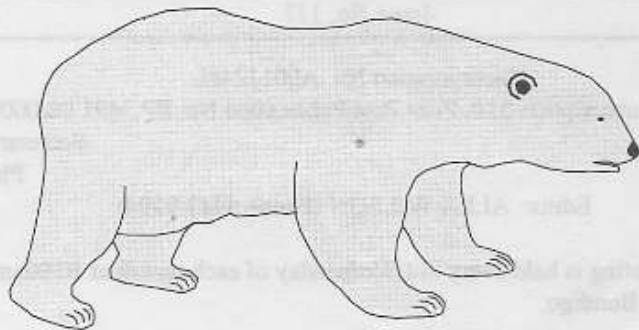
I hope that all players have an enjoyable winter, either at home or up north, and get plenty of practice to return to our first game in October.
